Noncredit State-Funded Courses

Community Education offers a number of non-credit classes for our community designed to meet the special needs, interests and capabilities of students who do not desire college unit credit. Although non-credit courses are based on college approved curriculum and taught by qualified instructors, they differ from credit courses in some respects. Noncredit courses are:

- There are no tests, guizzes or letter grades given
- Registration is quick and easy through the Community Education department

Older Adult Program

These courses are free for seniors and offered at numerous senior centers, community centers, residential care homes, and convalescent hospitals year-round. While these courses are offered primarily for senior citizens at locations and times convenient to them, they are open to all persons. The purpose of this program is to enable the older adult to have a better understanding of self-management. In addition, seniors are able to increase their awareness of consumer resources, and to enrich their learning potential by participating in individual development

Classes are provided in two general categories:

Art for Seniors - Art classes ranging from fine arts such as painting and history of art to classes in arts, crafts and art appreciation.
